Impact on Adult Learning

- 334 English language-learning and conversation classes had an attendance of 4,500.
- 115 U.S. citizenship classes drew an attendance of 1,200.
- 235 sessions of adult education tutoring offered help with job readiness, GED preparation, life skills and more.
- The number of one-on-one job search consultations doubled.

Impact on Local Businesses

- 260 one-on-one help sessions were held with local entrepreneurs at the Central Library and eight branches.
- More than 70 business workshops and networking events drew 1,400 people.
- 40 community partners enhanced the Library's small business program, including the UW Entrepreneurial Law Clinic Workshops and the Islamic Finance Network.

Impact on Cultural & Civic Engagement

- More than 1,200 people attended Seattle Reads events for Thi Bui's "The Best We Could Do."
- Peak Picks books were checked out 217,000 times.
- Two virtual reality exhibits explored topics such as the Great Seattle Fire.
- Indigenous youth from the Clear Sky Native Youth Council worked on oral histories supporting efforts to make Licton Springs Seattle's first-ever Native landmark.
- Legendary Children, a civic leadership project with queer and transgender artists of color, was attended by 1,600.

Impact on People in Need

- 675 Wi-Fi hot spots circulated nearly 8,000 times, and 250 additional Wi-Fi hot spots were checked out to neighbors most impacted by the digital divide.
- We made more than 909 socialservice referrals for 775 people.
- Nearly 7,000 patrons received Tax Help.
- "Read To Me!" provided early literacy training to incarcerated parents, who recorded themselves reading stories for their young children.

Impact on Student Success

- More than 8,500 children and teens attended 270 programs and events.
- 70 elementary schools participated in Global Reading Challenge's 24th year.
- Homework Help sessions at 11 locations were attended 12,000 times.
- More than 2,700 story times were held, with a total attendance of 78,000.
- 200 Kaleidoscope Play and Learn sessions had a total attendance of 8,900.
